How to Grow Celery from a Stalk

Here is an interesting and fun project: Cut 2 inches from the base of a stalk of celery. Put the cut celery base in a bowl (glass is best) and add enough warm water so that about 2/3 of the celery base is submerged. Place the bowl in a place that has plenty of natural light. Change the water every 2 to 3 days. After 5 to 7 days you should have new shoots growing from the center of the celery base.

Now it is time to transplant the celery stalk into soil. Use a pot that is about 5 inches high and about 6 inches wide at the top. Put soil in the pot leaving enough room at the top to set the stalk in the center. Continue to put in soil around the stalk until only the new shoots are showing above the soil. Water your new celery plant generously. Check the soil for moisture and water as necessary. You can also use a spray bottle daily. It is important to keep the plant watered and in an area that has a lot of natural light. In 4 to 5 months you will have a whole new stalk of celery to harvest, cut the bottom off, eat and enjoy. Start all over with the new bottom for another new stalk of celery.
